



What is Work-Based Learning?

- Work-Based Learning includes an agreement between the employer and the student and school system.
 - Development of a detailed training plan of competencies to be learned on the job and specifically what tasks student will perform on the job.
 - Commitment to allow the student to work enough hours each week to earn their course credit.
 - Periodic evaluations of employability skills and progress toward improvement at performing the competencies on the training plan.
 - Adherence to all State and Federal labor laws and regulations for working with youth.
 - 1 school year commitment

WBL Categories for Students

ESD

- Development of employability skills
- No more than 25% of placements
 - Paid
- Currently or previously enrolled in CTAE pathway course

YAP

- Application of coursework already taken and new skill development, culminating in an industry-recognized credential
- One (1) unit of CTAE credit already earned
 - Post-secondary/industry recognized credential or 720 hours on-the-job training
 - Paid or non-paid

CO-OP

- Placement is application of what is being learned concurrently in class
 - Concurrently enrolled in CTAE pathway course matching job placement
 - Paid

INTERNSHIP

- Application of skills and knowledge in related pathway courses
- One (1) unit of CTAE credit already earned
 - Paid or non-paid







Sample Placements

Who can participate in WBL?

- In order to participate you must:
 - Meet the deadline for application submission
 Friday, November 17, 2023.
 - Age 15+
 - Provide own transportation if not at an RCPS school-based enterprise
 - Have a minimum 2.5 GPA (Healthcare and Ag. Vet. Science minimum of 3.0 GPA)
 - Have acceptable attendance and discipline history
 - Be on track for graduation
 - Receive acceptable recommendations (will be provided to School Counselor and CTAE Pathway Teacher to complete once your application has been submitted)

- Attend Student Athletic Aide Camp in the summer if applying for student athletic aide- dates TBA
- Have one or more periods available in schedule
- Be willing to submit to all health-related screenings/drug tests, vaccinations, etc., as required by the employer
- Be willing to work a minimum of the following hours:
 - * 7.5 hours every 2 weeks for 1 period of WBL
 - * 15 hours every 2 weeks for 2 periods of WBL
 - * 22.5 hours every 2 weeks for 3 periods of WBL
- Parents and students must attend a required student/parent orientation in the summer before fall placement starts (failure to attend will result in withdrawal from the program)

WORK REQUIREMENTS

Additional Information

- -A student who has not taken a pathway course is **not eligible** for Work-Based Learning.
- Priority for acceptance will go to students who have completed and passed 2-3 years of pathway courses in the same pathway(s) by the beginning of the 2024-2025 school year
- (ie. Basic Maint. & Light Repair and Automotive Technologies II or Intro. To Healthcare Sci., Essentials of Healthcare, and Allied Health & Med.).

First-year student in pathway can apply and be considered but must have completed and passed 1 year of a pathway course(s) and be enrolled in the 2nd year of the course by the beginning of the 2024-2025 school year

- Follow up notification of acceptance with additional actions required (ie. Resume, join WBL Remind, text phone number to WBL Coordinator, etc.



June-August 2024

- Interviews/acceptances of
- Attend mandatory Student/Parent Orientation meeting
- Spend 1st 2 weeks of school in class w/WBL Coordinator at RCA
- Begin placements

- Notification of acceptance for 2024-2025 school year
- -Counselors and Registrars notified of student acceptance

December 2023

- Interviews for WBL placements
- -Student Athletic Aide Camp
- -Finalize WBL student schedules
- -Meeting for potential hospital placement students

May/June 2024
